#### **Rigorous Curriculum**

RBHS offers a variety of challenging courses at levels including College Prep (CP), Honors, College Board Advanced Placement (AP), and Dual Enrollment (DE). CP courses are offered in all core subjects. There are sixty-two (69) Honors level courses offered in English, Math, Science, Social Studies, World Language, Fine Arts, and Career and Technology. In addition, RBHS offers the following AP courses: Biology, Calculus AB & BC, Chemistry, Computer Science Principles, English Language & Composition, English Literature & Composition, Environmental Science, French Language and Culture, Human Geography, Latin, Macroeconomics, Physics 1: Algebra-Based, Physics C, Physics C: Electricity &Magnetism, Physics C: Mechanics, Psychology, Spanish Language and Culture, Statistics, Studio Art: 2-D Design, Studio Art: 3D Design, Studio Art: Drawing, United States Government & Politics, United States History and World History. Students may choose to attend Lexington Technology Center and other high schools in the district with Centers for Advanced Study for additional career and technical course offerings as a part of their high school curriculum. ### Attendance and Credits

To earn one unit of credit in a yearlong course, a student must have a passing average and no more than 10 unexcused absences. For semester courses (.5 unit), a student must have no more than five unexcused absences.

### South Carolina Uniform Grading Scale

The SC Board of Education has adopted a uniform grading policy for SC Public Schools which established weighting for class rank purposes. Information about the SC Uniform Grading Policy can be found at: <u>www.ed.sc.gov</u>. GPAs are calculated on a **4.0 weighted scale**. SC transitioned to a 10-point Grade Scale in 2016-17. Prior year courses were evaluated on a 7-point Grade Scale (see below). ## End-of-Course Examination Program (EOCEP)

EOC examinations count as 20% of the final grade and are administered in each gateway or benchmark course. They currently include English 1, Algebra 1/Intermediate Algebra, Biology and US History. Courses in which an EOC exam is given must be passed in order to graduate.

#### Athletics

RBHS student-athletes compete in the Class AAAAA Conference of the South Carolina High School League. To participate, student-athletes must provide a copy of their original birth certificate and have a current health physical.
